Most Hearing Association branches provide the following services. However you should check with the smaller branches to see what services they can provide:

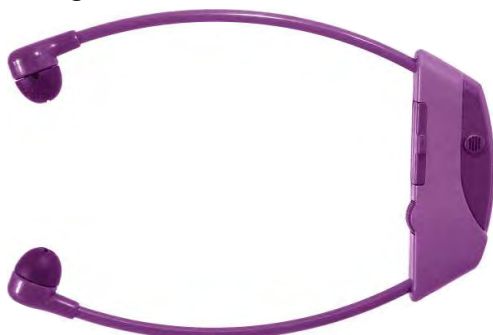
- hearing tests by appointment
